REBECCA HOGAN has been developing and advancing policies and related political strategies for Wisconsin policy-makers and businesses for 15 years. She joined Hamilton Consulting in 2013 where she advocates for clients in policy areas such as health care and workforce development.

Before joining Hamilton, Rebecca served as the Director of Health and Human Resources Policy at Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce (WMC), the state's largest trade association representing business. While at WMC, Rebecca lobbied the legislature on health care policy and human resources issues such as unemployment insurance, worker's compensation, education, and the Family Medical Leave Act.

Rebecca spent eight years in the Wisconsin State Senate working for a number of senators, including the current co-chair of the Joint Committee on Finance, Alberta Darling, and vice co-chair, Luther Olsen. Her responsibilities as Legislative Director included preparing analysis and policy recommendations for committee fiscal deliberations and managed media relations and guidance to constituents.

In addition to her legislative experience, Rebecca has served as the Deputy Director for the Committee to Elect a Republican Senate, where she conducted all administrative and financial management and fundraising activities, and was the Regional Coordinator for the Governor Thompson Committee.

Rounding out her background in state government, Rebecca served as a research and policy advisor at the Wisconsin Department of Financial Institutions. In this position she drafted bill summaries on legislation introduced or supported by the agency, and researched project assignments and wrote informational papers on the financial industry.

Rebecca holds a Bachelor's degree from UW-Madison in Political Science and International Relations. She has received appointments from the Secretary of the Department of Workforce Development to the Wisconsin Apprenticeship Advisory Council and from Gov. Scott McCallum as the liaison to the United States Mint for the Wisconsin Commemorative Quarter Project.
